With the water level rising in the lake, it should be possible to have a good boating and event season for 2015-16, which will help to increase our trading income over the summer months.

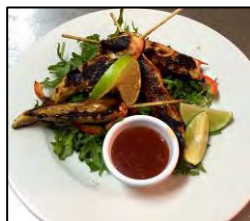
Once again I thank all members and their guests for their continual support of the club.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

Vegetarian spaghetti with tomato, chickpeas, rocket and feta

Serves 4

Ingredients:

- | | |
|-------------------------------------|---|
| 1 red onion, finely chopped | 400g can no-added-salt chopped tomatoes |
| 2 sticks celery, diced | 400g can no-added-salt chickpeas, rinsed, drained |
| 2 cloves garlic, crushed | 300g wholemeal spaghetti |
| 1/4 teaspoon dried red chili flakes | 120g baby rocket leaves |
| 100g low-fat feta, crumbled | |



Method:

1. Heat a medium saucepan over medium heat and spray base with olive oil. Add onion and celery and cook, stirring occasionally, for 5 minutes or until softened. Add garlic and chili flakes and cook for a further 30 seconds. Add tomato, 1/4 cup water and chickpeas. Reduce the heat to low and cook for 10 minutes or until thickened.
2. Meanwhile, cook pasta in a large saucepan of boiling water following packet instructions. Drain well and return to pan.
3. Add tomato mixture and rocket to pasta and toss to combine. Sprinkle over feta and serve.
